

Practice statement

Ian Salisbury is a chartered architect with a chartered practice. Experience includes award-winning new-build and conservation schemes for several Oxford University Colleges, international company head-offices in London, estate housing in England and Scotland, schools, industrial buildings, sporting facilities, refurbishment and restoration work, private houses and the extension and improvement of churches. In 1999 he was the runner-up for the King of Prussia's Gold Medal for the repair and restoration of a Grade I listed church. He is the Cathedral Architect of Leicester Cathedral.

Overseas projects have included two large campuses for the King Saud University in Saudi Arabia (student population 25,000) including teaching hospitals (human and veterinary), teaching faculties, sporting facilities, healthcare centres, administration offices and multiple housing schemes. Also in Saudi Arabia there have been villas for eminent people, including the chairman of a large international monetary agency. Sensitive strategic planning advice has been given to the Electricity Authority in Cyprus.

Alongside a dispute resolution practice, consultancy experience includes client advice on site development potential, planning strategy, advice on procurement as well as project management of live projects and acting as client representative. Planning appeals have to date all been successful, and success has also been complete with all schemes petitioned in the Consistory Court. Based on his architectural reputation, Ian Salisbury has been appointed in several hundred dispute resolution cases in which a very high proportion (about 70%) reach swift and amicable resolution.
